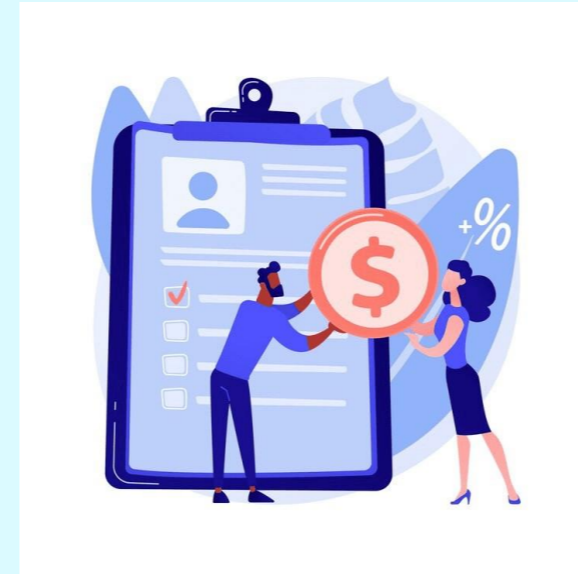


A Cross-Sectional Investigation of Counselors'-In-Training and Counselor Educators & Supervisors' Sexual Attitudes and Wellness (IRB # c0924.7e)

W E W A N T T O H E A R F R O M Y O U !

Purpose

This research study seeks to investigate the relationship between sexual attitudes and wellness endorsed by both counselors-in-training (CIT) and counselor educators and/or supervisors (CE/S).



Incentives

Not only will participant responses contribute to the lack of evidence concerning CIT and CE/S attitudes and how it relates to overall wellness, but participant will have the opportunity to be entered into a random drawing for a gift card: Eight (8) \$50 gift cards and fourteen (14) \$25 gift cards. Four (4) \$50 gift cards will be reserved for CIT participants and four (4) will be reserved for CE/S participants. Seven (7) \$25 gift cards will be reserved for CIT participants and seven (7) will be reserved for CE/S participants. Following the close of the survey, eleven (11) CIT participants and eleven (11) CE/S participants will be selected at random to receive one of the above-mentioned gift cards.

Who Can Participate?

Both counselors-in-training (CITs) and counselor educators and/or counselor supervisors (CE/S) are encouraged to participate! Eligibility requirements will vary based on professional identity, but all participants must meet the following criteria to be eligible for the study:

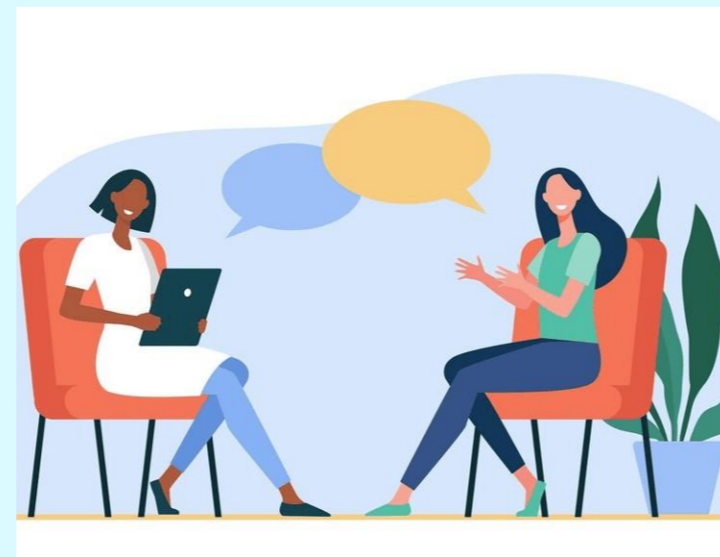
1. Must be 18 years or older
2. Must be physically in the United States of America

Eligibility criteria for CITs:

- **If a student CIT:**
 1. Be currently enrolled in a CACREP accredited program
 2. Must have completed, and successfully passed, their Practicum course
 3. Not be independently licensed
- **If a graduate CIT:**
 1. Graduated from a CACREP accredited program
 2. Be currently working, at least, part-time (20 hrs/wk) as a professional counselor-in-training or professional school counselor-in-training
 3. Not be independently licensed

Eligibility criteria for CE/S's:

1. Graduated with a minimum of a Masters degree from a CACREP accredited program
2. Have completed the requisite training and education necessary to supervise CITs
3. Be actively providing supervision to CITs at Practicum, Internship and/or post-graduate level
